

Hi there, awesome adult!

As we talk more and more about our In Greeley for Good capital campaign, we know that your kids will likely hear about it and they may ask questions. We love questions!

We've designed this packet to help you talk to your kids about what a capital campaign is, what we're doing, and how they can be part of it. We hope it can lead to meaningful conversations in your family around what it means to be part of this moment in our congregation's life. You can use it any way you'd like, but here are a few suggestions:

- Start with the "guide for understanding and participating in our capital campaign." Read it together, talk about it, and encourage your child to respond to the prompts in whatever way feels right to them. It's okay if their dreams and ideas don't seem realistic. This is a chance for them to let God speak to them however God is speaking to them. Maybe in glue, maybe in drawings, maybe in words, and maybe in another way! Talk about how they've responded. Encourage them to keep the half that talks about the campaign and bring the half with their ideas and dreams back to share with our team.
- Read the "gift guide for kids" together. Talk about each of the ideas in it. Notice whether or not there is a way to engage that seems exciting to your child and help them imagine it in more detail. Talk about whether or not they'll need help from adults to complete their ideas. If they do, but you're not up to it, please let us know! We'd love to find adults who can help your child make their ideas happen!
- As you consider your pledge, talk about it as a family. Include kids in your decision and explain to them your thought processes behind it. Talk about what it means for your family. If you're giving up something (a vacation, a night out, a subscription, etc.) to make your pledge, talk about why that's the thing you've chosen to give up. If you're doing something extra, talk about that, too!
